New Framework for Human Development

PROGRAMME

CONTEXT

The Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) are promoting the National Dialogues for Development Series as part of the International Cooperation Project BRA/23/023 —Brazil in the Third Decade of the XXI Century: The Dissemination of the Results of the 13th Population Census of the Country.

This initiative aims to build spaces for technical debates on key themes to foster Human Development. The Second National Dialogue for Development, titled ***New Framework for Human Development in Brazil***, will focus on critical topics that can enhance the trajectory of human development in the country, particularly in the context of global, regional, and national challenges.

The discussions will refer to national and international documents. At the national level, the ***Brazilian Strategy 2050***, developed by the Ministry of Planning and Budget, and the ***Ecological Transformation Plan***, published by the Ministry of Finance, will serve as foundational documents. These plans aim to explore pathways for promoting greater social, environmental, and economic development in Brazil, with an emphasis on reducing inequalities and

addressing systemic pressures that affect the planning and implementation of public policies.

To provide a global perspective, the ***Human Development Report 2019***, produced by the United Nations Development Programme, and the results of the 4th International Conference on Financing for Development will be presented, with emphasis on the ***World of Debt Report***, produced by UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD).

The ***2019 Report*** remains more relevant than ever in debating the inequalities that persist in the trajectory of human development and that exacerbate distances between those who have reached higher levels of development and those who have not. In turn, the ***UNCTAD Report*** complements the set of references by reflecting on what are the viable ways to enable the financing of growth and sustainable development, in an environment characterized by multiple uncertainties and with countries with debts that increasingly compromise their investment capacity.

To reflect on the structural problems, the current situation and the future scenario that outline Brazil's performance in terms of development, the Second Dialogue will feature experts

and stakeholders, including government representatives and members from civil society institutions.

The event will consist of discussion panels and will be documented through video recordings and reports. Additionally, there will be an opportunity for participants to record short videos in which they can share their perspectives on the challenges and opportunities for development in Brazil.
